

Policy & Practice Recommendations

Association of Women's Health, Obstetric and Neonatal Nurses



Screen for Maternal Mental Health Disorders in Pregnancy

A risk factor for CB-PTSD/P-PTSD is untreated maternal anxiety/depression and prior trauma such as sexual assault.

Reduce Traumatic Birth

Traumatic birth can arise from high levels of medical intervention, long and/or extremely painful labor or perceived lack of support.



Policy Recommendations

Integrate MH screening/tx into prenatal & postpartum care

State Medicaid and Commercial Insurers should Implement HRSA & ACOG Guidelines:

- Unbundle OB reimbursement for MMH and postpartum through 12 mos
- Track Screening and Follow-up rates (HEDIS)
- Track HCAHPS patient reported satisfaction with hospital experience
- Implement Quality Improvement Interventions, to incentivize change

Build up Mental Health Workforce, including Psychologists

Congress, State Legislatures and HRSA

 Provide grants/scholarships to train additional psychologists to support MMH including assessment and tx of CB-PTSD


